PCB Fact Sheet/Billing insert:

- BiJay gave an update from the SRSB meeting. Liberty Lake, City of Post Falls, Hayden, and City of Coeur d' Alene are all on board to include the PCB fact sheet in their billing inserts.
- Questions regarding the billing inserts:
 - O Who will provide the paper copies?
 - o Can we distribute an electronic copy to the agencies?
 - O Who sends out paper copies and who sends out electronic?
 - O What if they have a 3rd party that does the billing, who will pay for that?
 - o Timing- when do we want to send the billings out?
 - We had discussion about this and we do not want to muddy the waters of the spring campaign.
 - We decided it would be best to do the billing insert right after the spring campaign, in July. We discussed talking to Tonilee and seeing if she can include something about the billing inserts into the last week of the spring campaign.
 - Vikki will talk to Tonilee to see what it would take to add the statement about the billing insert into the radio spots, and if any messages need to be rerecorded to include the billing insert.
 - BiJay will figure out the billing timings for all agencies. Chelsea asked if there
 was a way to track who gets it, when they would get it, maybe do a
 spreadsheet. By tracking this, we might be able to see if there are hits to the
 PCB page or waste directory.
 - BiJay will also look to see which agencies are willing to put the billing inserts on their websites and who uses a 3rd party for billings. Also see if there are other constraints with any of the utility providers.
 - Vikki will find out from Toni Taylor to see if google analytics is currently running on the SRRTTF PCB page.
 - Karl Nice Job to Toni on all her hard work on the handout.
