Agenda Items Discussed:

1. Road Paint Whitepaper:

- a. The next level draft is available from Journalist Sonja Elmquist but has not been distributed beyond NWGC.
- b. Good starting point for technical case study format.
- c. NWGC offered to develop the "technical case study" and estimates the cost to be a couple thousand dollars. The workgroup requested a brief proposal for this work with billing rates, scope and who will be working on the document.
- d. The next level draft will be reviewed by the workgroup prior to finalization and distribution to the full SRRTTF.
- 2. **OECD** (Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development) Eeva Leinala, Principal Administrator of the Environment Health and Safety Division sated that there is a workshop in February and they are looking for real world examples/case studies of policy misalignments and believes that the implications to recycling waste streams due to the TSCA and WQS regulatory paradox provides an excellent case study.
 - a. Abstracts are due October 11
 - b. February 11 deadline for complete application submittals, so we have time to provide additional detail
 - c. Although this would be an excellent opportunity for the SRRTTF to sponsor, there is insufficient time to gain SRRTT F approval. The workgroup agreed that IEP should submit in the interim and attempt to gain SRRTTF approval for the February 11 deadline for complete application submittals.
 - d. Doug to take a leadership role with the assistance of NWGC to make happen
 - e. Doug provided a draft for review and requested comments no later than October 9 to provide time for revision.
